

SPORTS PREMIUM 2015/2016

Sport Premium is an amount of money which the government has agreed to allocate to schools to increase the quality & breadth of PE & Sport provision, and increase participation in PE & Sport. The funding amount received by schools is based upon the number of children of primary age at the school.

In the year 2015 - 2016 we will receive £8365.

In this year we will spend on P.E £9310

The following table shows how we plan to use the Sports Premium monies to support the continued development of P.E and Sport at Beckwithshaw. The total amount spend exceeds the sport premium funding therefore showing that the school already commits to the development of PE and Sport.

The priorities were identified by using the Youth Sport Trust Self Review tool in relation to PE, Sport and Physical Activity as well as looking at the individual needs of the school.
